DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

TAB 1 Raphaelae Lataillade a/k/a Raphaelae Wagner, OT, DOH Case Number 2015
18935 OT10833, File #10268 (PCP Members - Johnson and Spafford)

Ms. Raphaelae Lataillade Wagner was present, not represented by legal counsel and was sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Giliani presented this case to the Board stating this is a one-count Administrative Complaint alleging Respondent had action taken against her license to practice occupational therapy by the licensing authority of another state. The DC Board of Occupational Therapy disciplined Respondent for failing to provide appropriate direct supervision to an occupational therapist assistant (OTA). Respondent was also disciplined for practicing with an unlicensed person when it was discovered the OTA she was supposed to supervise was not actually licensed in DC. Respondent was reprimanded, ordered to pay a \$1,000 fine, ordered to take continuing education courses, and her license was suspended until she completed all of these terms. Respondent does not dispute the allegations and has agreed to enter into this Settlement Agreement. In response to this Complaint, Respondent stated she made several attempts to supervise the OTA in question and was the one to report the OTA to the Board. Respondent also states she was unaware that this "OTA" was not licensed; Respondent's employer represented to Respondent that this individual was a licensed OTA. Respondent has already been disciplined by the DC Board and Respondent has been made aware of any underlying concerns regarding her practice of occupational therapy. Furthermore, Respondent has been licensed in Florida for 14 years with no prior discipline. The Department took all of this into consideration when entering into this Settlement Agreement and believes the terms are reasonable and appropriate.

Terms of the Settlement Agreement as presented:

- Reprimand
- \$500 fine, to be paid within 90 days
- Reimbursement of Costs (\$511.46), within 90 days

Note: Respondent has already paid the fine and costs in anticipation of the Settlement Agreement being presented to the Board.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Banta made a motion to reject the Settlement Agreement as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 3/0 vote.

MOTION: Ms. Banta made a motion to offer the following counter stipulation to include the completion of continuing education CPE Pro B course, or a Board-approved equivalent ethics course within 6 months. Any equivalent course suggestion to be reviewed and approved by the Board Chair. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 3/0 vote.

Ms. Wagner accepted the counter offer.

Terms of the Settlement Agreement including the counter stipulation offer as presented:

- Reprimand
- \$500 fine
- Reimbursement of Costs (\$511.46)
- Completion of a CPE Pro B or Board-approved equivalent ethics course within 6 months – any equivalent course suggestion to be reviewed/approved by Board Chair.

INFORMAL HEARING

**TAB 2 Lourdes Ocampo, Informal Hearing, Case Number 2014-21178,
OT10008, File #9423 (PCP Members - Johnson and McKenzie)**

Ms. Ocampo was not present, and not represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Giliani presented this case to the Board stating the Administrative Complaint alleges

Respondent pled guilty to a crime related to health care fraud. On December 5, 2014, Respondent pled guilty to False Statements Related to Health Care matters. By doing so, Respondent admitted to knowingly and willfully making materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statements and representations in the entry of the delivery and payment for health care benefits, items, and services. Specifically, on or about July 17, 2009, Respondent prepared a Plan of Care which falsely stated that Respondent had performed an occupational therapy evaluation on a Medicare beneficiary when she did not, in fact, perform such an evaluation. Respondent elected an informal hearing, meaning she does not dispute the issues of material fact but wished to present oral or written statements to the Board for purposes of mitigation.

An email request for a continuance was presented from Ms. Ocampo by Board staff.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Spafford made a motion to deny Ms. Ocampo's request for a second continuance. The motion was seconded by Ms. Banta and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford moved to find the Respondent was properly served and requested an informal hearing. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to adopt the materials in Tab 2 into evidence in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to adopt the findings of fact as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to adopt the conclusions of law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and find that this constitutes a violation of the practice act. The motion was seconded Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Spafford made a motion to revoke Ms. Ocampo's occupational therapist license. The motion was seconded Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to waive all costs. The motion was seconded Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

TAB 3 Cielo Zapata, Informal Hearing, Case Number 2015-25143, OT3191, File #3018 (PCP Members - Johnson and McKenzie)

Ms. Zapata was not present, and not represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Giliani presented this case to the Board stating the Administrative Complaint alleges Respondent pled guilty to a crime related to health care fraud and furthermore failed to report it to the Board, in writing, within 30 days. On February 18, 2015, Respondent pled guilty to Conspiracy to Commit Health Care Fraud. By doing so, Respondent admitted that from January 2008 through January 2010, Respondent conspired with others to defraud the Medicare Program by falsely certifying occupational therapy services she did not provide, thereby causing the submission of false and fraudulent claims to the Medicare Program seeking payment for services not rendered to Medicare beneficiaries. Respondent did not timely report this plea to the Board in 30 days. Respondent elected an informal hearing, meaning she does not dispute the issues of material fact but wished to present evidence to the Board for purposes of

mitigation.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford moved to find the Respondent was properly served and requested an informal hearing. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to adopt the materials in Tab 2 into evidence in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion to adopt the findings of fact as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried with a 4/0 vote.

TAB 4 Final Appearance: Duanda Clark, OT 15275, File #14865

Ms. Clark, and her Supervisor Ms. Cheryl Handy was present, not represented by legal counsel and both were sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Clark was disciplined by the Board at the November 2, 2015 meeting, requiring fines, costs and a year probation, requiring quarterly reports from a Board approved monitor. Final appearance is required to terminate her probation.

Compliance Officer, Ms. Towanda Burnett stated Ms. Clark was in compliance with the Board's order. The Board accepted Ms. Clark's Final Appearance before the Board and supervision as satisfactorily completed. Ms. Clark submitted a payment to the compliance officer regarding fines and/or costs required in her Final Order.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. McKenzie made a motion to accept Ms. Clark's last appearance and completion of probation requirements to terminate probation as required by the board order. The motion was seconded Ms. Banta and carried with a 5/0 vote.

RULES REVIEW AND OR DEVELOPMENT *(and any other rules as may be necessary)*

TAB 19 Rule 64B11-5.001, F.A.C., Requirements for License Renewal of an Active License; Continuing Education

After discussion regarding a pro-bono continuing education request at the Board's October 2016 meeting, the Board Chair requested further discussion to clarify whether a licensee must seek approval for pro-bono continuing education credit prior to offering such services or may request credit after the pro-bono services are rendered. The Board expressed their agreement in the language reflecting prior approval be received prior to performance of services. Board counsel provided for the Board's review the following drafted language including underlying statutory provisions for reference.

64B11-5.001 (15) Performance of Pro Bono Services – A licensee may receive up to six (6) hours per biennium of continuing education credit through the performance of pro bono services to the indigent as provided in Section 456.013(9), F.S., or to underserved populations, or in areas of critical need within the state where the licensee practices. In order to receive credit under this rule, licensees must make a written request to the Board and receive approval **prior to performing pro bono services in advance.** One (1) hour credit shall be given for each two (2) hours worked. In the written request, licensees shall disclose the type, nature and extent of services to be rendered, the facility where the services will be rendered, the number of patients expected to be serviced, and a statement indicating that the patients to be served are indigent. If the licensee intends to provide services in underserved or critical need areas, the written request shall provide a brief explanation as to those facts.

MOTION: Ms. McKenzie made a motion to accept the drafted language as presented by Board Counsel. The motion was seconded by Ms. Banta and carried with a 5/0 vote.

MOTION: Mr. Spafford made a motion that the Rule amendments will not have an adverse impact on small business, and is not likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida, within 1 year after the implementation of the rule. The motion was seconded by Ms. McKenzie and carried with a 5/0 vote.

Ms. McNulty made a statement of information to the Board members regarding a complaint that had been filed in Federal court in Tallahassee by 3 physicians licensed by the FL Board of Medicine and an occupational therapist seeking licensure with the Board. The complaint named the

Board of Occupational Therapy Practice as one of the defendants in the complaint. Each plaintiff in the case had a felony conviction for drug possession, drug disposition or organized crime. The defendants had informed each plaintiff in the case that their application would be denied for renewal licensure per 456.0635, F.S. which prohibits issuance of licensure with certain convictions. The plaintiffs sought a preliminary injunction enjoining the Boards from applying the statutes because they claimed, it applied retroactively and it violated the US Constitution. On December 21, 2016 the US District Court for the Northern District in Tallahassee denied the plaintiffs motion for preliminary injunction, because the court found they had not demonstrated substitutional likelihood of success on the merit, because the constitutional claims were not valid and the statute operates prospectively. On January 4, 2017 the plaintiffs withdrew their lawsuit.
